We combine profitable business operations with treatment, housing, and training facilities. The on-campus businesses help fund the program, and provide income for the students.

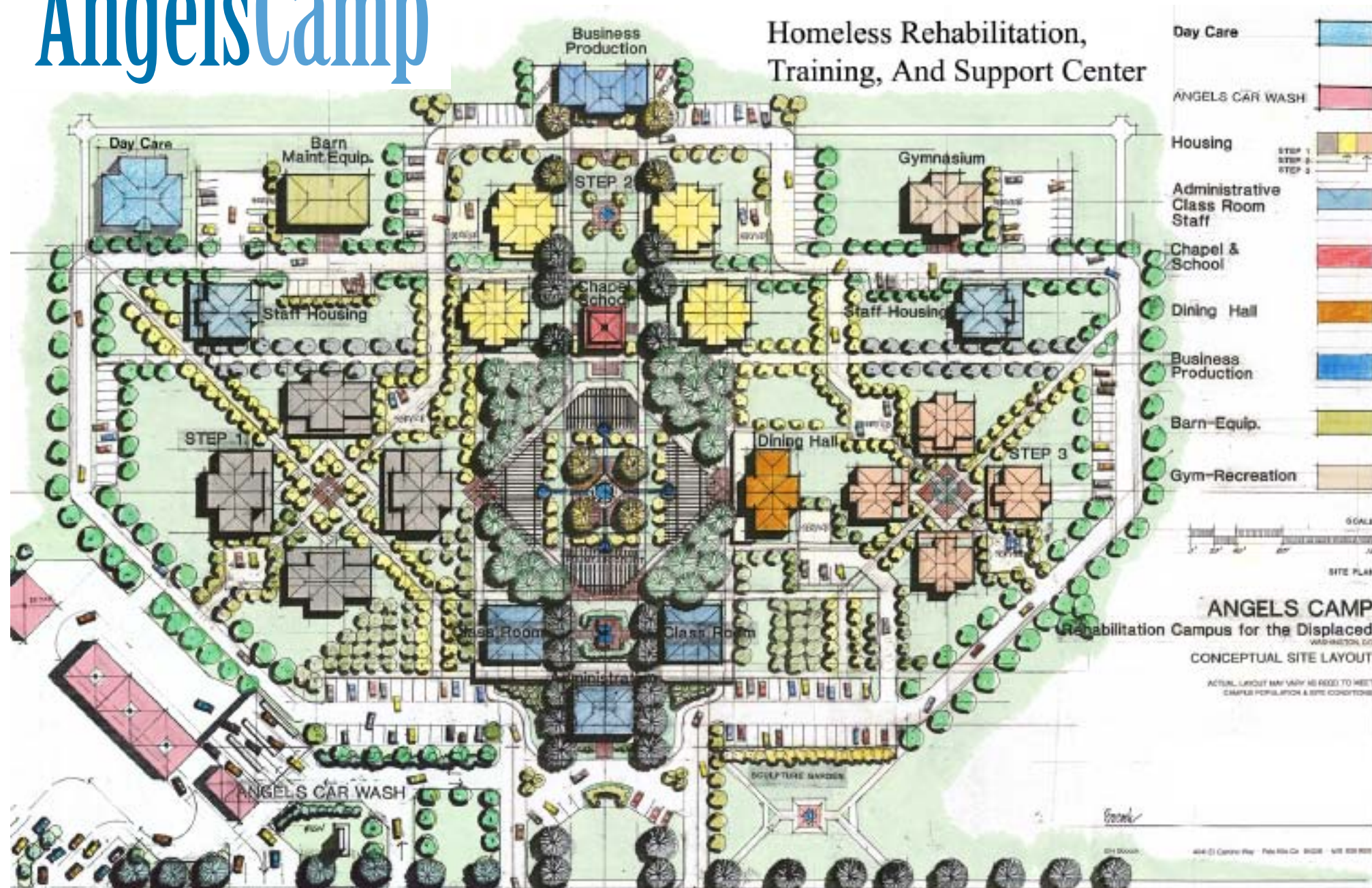

The Process:

- Accepted “Students” must commit to the Angels Camp program.
- Students begin their stay in Step 1 dormitory-style housing.
- Student health will be assessed and attended to in an on-site clinic, dental facility, and mental health clinic.
- Students attend a broad range of courses based on their individual needs, including hygiene, etiquette, financial management, and high school equivalency exam preparation.
- Peer-to-peer training groups, mental health treatment, substance abuse education, and support groups are a part of the curriculum as well.
- Career training will be taught in classrooms and on-site businesses.
- Students will work in on-site businesses, and contribute to the labor needed to operate the campus.
- Hourly wages will be paid to all students, with 75% withheld by Angels Camp for the student’s use after graduation. The remainder will be accessible to the student for use only on campus via a debit card system.
- Upon completing goals of Step 1, Students move to Step 2 group home housing, and finally on to Step 3, where they share their room with one roommate.
- Facilities will also be available for family groups.

A long-term vision

Angels Camp has designed our program with long-term goals in mind. Students will gain responsibility and improve their living conditions as they demonstrate their commitment to grow. Three phases of housing will provide progressively independent living situations as students progress through education and rehabilitation programs. The final phase will place students in cooperative housing arrangements outside the campus to help them in their transition to self-reliance.

And our vision doesn’t end there. We hope our first campus will become one of many, as this plan is replicated in cities across the nation. We are committed to protecting the rights of the homeless and leading the way to end homelessness in America.
